Mangere Bridge Santa Parade

The flashing lights and siren of the police patrol car heralded the start of the parade at 6.30pm. This was followed by the Manukau Pipes and Drums and behind them three vintage cars carrying VIP's including Mayor Len Brown. The crowd, estimated at 6,000, lined the footpaths to watch the parade which this year had 54 participating groups. Floats entered included; Ambury Farm Park, Girl Guides with their Wacky Sheep, Papakura Coastguard, Asics Drive (which won best dressed street for Rugby World Cup), St John Youth Division, Mangere Bridge Kindergarten, Play Centre, St Anthony's Church, Manukau Rovers Rugby Football Club, Super Value, vintage cars, jeeps, speedway cars, and many others. Pedestrian 'floats' including Cubs and Keas, Onehunga-Mangere Soccer and Softball Clubs, Sea Scouts, the Pony Club, Mangere Bridge Primary School, Walking School Buses, Mangere Bridge Walking Group and the SPCA Dog Squad which was a great favourite along the route.

Bananas in Pyjamas (B1 & B2) and their friends, Shrek, Puss 'n Boots and Donkey, Bat Man and Robin and others boogied their way down the parade route stopping at regular intervals to pose for photos. Santa's float, complete with snow, came courtesy of Higgins Contractors and was decorated by Mangere Floral Studio. Santa had a walk-about meeting the children and handing out lollies which were donated by Bridge Mini Mart and Super Value.

There was lots of food to eat with two sausage sizzles plus candy floss, kettledrum popcorn and French crepes. There was also a steady queue for pony and cart rides and face painting. Once again the face paints were generously donated by Draw Art Supplies in Hastie Ave. The hugely entertaining Frank E. Evans Band rounded off the evening at the café strip.


Mangere Boat Club
