As I write this newsletter daylight saving is only a few days away and Super Value is ready to reopen after the fire four weeks ago. There have been many versions about what caused the fire however it was an electrical fault in the sub board that runs the fridges and freezers. Fortunately, being contained in a shaft separated from the shop by a block wall, the fire was contained within that area. The shop itself was undamaged but a lot of electrical wiring in the ceiling had to be replaced which took some time. The shop will sell all the usual range, including meat and frozen items but a slightly limited choice until the big freezer cabinets are operational in about three weeks. Look out for re-opening specials.

There is a line in an old song which says; "you don't know what you've got till it's gone" and this has certainly been the case with the supermarket out of action. The village has resembled a ghost town at times. As people have gone elsewhere for their groceries they have shopped outside the area so we hope they will all be back again soon.

Although there have been several opportunities for public engagement to discuss the Draft Area Plan, the majority of Mangere Bridge residents knew nothing about it and were quite alarmed at the proposal which contains apartment and terraced-style housing. However, the good news is that there will be a Mangere Bridge Railway station within the next ten years. With a growing preference for apartment-style living in Auckland it will be an attractive option for those not wishing to own a bit of land but desiring to live in a semi-rural environment close to a transport hub.

The Mangere Bridge Business Card Directory is to be updated soon. This is delivered to every mail box in Mangere Bridge. It's a valuable resource for the community and has a long shelf life. If you have a business you are eligible to be listed, however, as space is limited it will be first-come-first-served. The cost is \$60 plus GST.

What are you doing this summer? Your local Softball Club on Mangere Mountain is taking registrations for the summer. We have teams available for all ages! You can join a team, or enter your own team. We are on the same club grounds that are used for Soccer in the winter.

Tee ball is a version of softball for kids aged 4-8. The kids hit a ball off a flexible post called a tee, at home plate, then run around the bases to come home before the ball gets thrown back! Residents and Ratepayers Assoc.

Over thirty people turned out for our first meeting since the AGM. Roger Baldwin is again our Chairman, but is hoping someone will soon fill the position as he is now living "out of town" Quite a few new members present. Welcome also to Don Presland a new committee member who was not mentioned in last month's newsletter. Carol Anne Armitage, the Village Manager talked about Village matters, but her main topic was the Auckland Council draft Unitary Plan, and how it affected Mangere Bridge. With the amalgamation of the previous seven local bodies and all their local District Plans, Dog Controls and many other bylaws, one Unitary Plan is being developed for the new City. As far as Mangere Bridge is concerned, there are plans for higher density housing close to the Village and future rail line to the airport, and high rise apartments along Kiwi Esplanade. Council staff have held several workshops in the area and there has been a vigorous campaign in the neighbourhood by many residents to encourage folk to make their feelings known on this contentious matter. Council will now finalise the draft plan that will then be notified for public consultation. Carrol Elliot from the Mangere Otahuhu Local Board gave us a resume of the Boards activities. The Unitary Plan has occupied a lot of their time. She advised that tenders had been called for the redevelopment of the all tide boat ramp. The Board had made their submissions on the new footbridge. They sought a high section of the bridge so that pleasure craft could pass beneath. The Board also hoped for a wider bridge but said NZTA would only pay for a six metre bridge. Anything wider would have to be funded by the City Council. Bill told the meeting of where we were with the old bridge replacement. NZTA having received hundreds of suggestions from their weekend presentations were now sifting through them to see what the general consensus was. Following an open letter to the Mayor from many local organisations seeking a delay to the work on the ramp until the new bridge plans had been finalised, an email from the Mayors liaison officer advised that total responsibility for the ramp work lay with the Local Board who would have made rigorous investigations in to the proposal. Council could not intervene. He advised that should the Board decided to delay the work then the funds budgeted for the project could be held over for another year. Mark Erskine gave a concise report on progress with changing the attitude of Councils in the region over mangrove removal. Changes in Government coastal marine matters should accelerate this change. Locally, the Manukau Restoration Society were applying for consent to remove mangroves in the Mangere Bridge area and at Otahuhu, where the Waka are launched for the annual portage crossing race. Frances Higgins told the meeting of the new "Friends of Ambury Farm Park" group and their activities. Now's the time to join the Association to keep you up to date on Mangere Bridge affairs.
