Eggs did fly, at the NZ Rocketry ChallengeTen teams of year 7 & 8 students battled it out for the title of best rocket scientist, in the inaugural NZ Rocketry Challenge on Sunday, at Ambury Regional Park in Auckland.



Sunday after Christmas:

Christmas Eve:

Cheered on by a 150-strong crowd, these junior rocket engineers launched a raw hen's egg high into the air. To win, they needed to fly to a specific altitude, and their 'eggstronaut' had to come back safely and undamaged. Each rocket carried a digital altimeter to provide a precise reading of the height achieved.

A team from Diocesan School for Girls, Epsom took out the competition. Their best flight was only 3 metres off the target altitude of 150 metres. Second and third place teams came from Tauranga Intermediate School and Baradene College

After their first flight, teams were busy making tweaks to

their rockets, adding additional weight and trying to find the optimum egg-packing technique for success.

"The winning team showed great consistency, with their rocket being only 6 and 3 metres off the target altitude for their two flights," said Mark Mackay, executive director of KiwiSpace. "This is precisely what we were hoping for with the competition - application of good scientific methodology and aerospace engineering skills."

There were inevitably some failures that added to the drama and excitement of the day. Parachutes failed to open in some cases, resulting in ballistic re-entries – but impressively, some of the eggs survived these landings due to great 'passenger safety systems'.





The November meeting was attended by more than 70 residents. Almost as many as attended our AGM. The current interest was the proposed Central Interceptor which is a 4 ½ m tunnel from Western Springs to Mangere, that Watercare wishes to construct to carry a mixture of sewage and stormwater to the Treatment Plant at Mangere. The Associations objections to this proposal are that although initially there will be no increase in sewage coming to the plant, the large quantity of stormwatrer in big storm events that will be entering the Manukau could have serious effects on the fragile harbour. Also looking years ahead with population growth, we will find the bureaucrats will want to double the size of the treatment plant and divert more sewage through this tunnel to the detriment of the harbour and the increased spills of foul air on to our neighbourhood. There was a dreadful stench from the plant on Monday 21 at 2 am. Residents are urged to get submissions in by 3 December. Our Auckland Council Councillor Alf Filipaina addressed the meeting and explained how the make up of the new City did not allow him to have any input into the decisions of the Local Board. He agreed with the local concerns about the boat ramp proposals but was unable to voice our concerns with the Board. A message from the Local Board member Carrol Elliott advised that the all tide boat ramp modifications would start in April. A contractor has been selected. Bill reiterated the boating communities' complete opposition to the board's proposal as the modifications had not had public consultation and the outcome would be a ramp more dangerous than the present one. Senior Auckland Council management have advised that they can't interfere with Local Board decisions. This is a worrying impasse.. The mangrove workshop organised by our guru Mark Erskine was a resounding success. Representatives and MPs from Mangawhai to Whangamata were unanimous in their intention to lobby Parliament to change the ridiculous rules set by local councils that are making money out of consent fees charged for groups to wrest their foreshores from the invasion of mangroves. Citizens have to pay the fees, do the removal and dispose of the weeds. Hardly fair. There will be no meeting in December (too close to Christmas). January meeting will be on the 16th at the St. James Church Hall at 7.30 pm.
