Village Happenings

After a very long, hot summer, winter arrived early and it's been quite noticeable how quiet the village is at the moment. However, it is essential that we continue to support our small shops over the winter months.

Complaints have been lodged with various council officers over the state of our footpaths, with leaf fall over autumn, and the severe drop in the service level since Auckland Transport took over the responsibility for cleaning of footpaths. These are now only swept once a week and gutters once a month. The build-up of leaves over recent weeks has blocked drains and the footpaths have been slippery and unsafe, especially for our disabled residents. If you see the footpaths in a bad state please lodge a complaint with the Call Centre on 301 0101. Always ask for a reference number.

The Sunday Boutique Market now has a core group of 20 stalls, depending on the weather. It is pleasing to see how well it has grown and the number of visitors it attracts to the area. If you haven't been down to the Village on a Sunday for a while check out the new stalls which include 'Over the Moon' Specialty Cheeses, Zina's Preserves, Dog Treats and The Soap Deli with the most amazing soaps I have ever seen. They look good enough to eat!

At the time of writing celebrations for Matariki are underway. Mangere Bridge Primary School's Kapa Haka group will perform on 5 July at 12.30pm in the Village Square and the Boutique Market will have a Matariki Focus on 7 July. Also check out the library's Matariki events.

The orange Airporter bus is now a regular sight in the village. The 380 Manukau City Centre to Onehunga via Auckland Airport timetable does not display a timing point for Mangere Bridge; however it is estimated that the service from the Onehunga Train Station to Mangere Bridge by Hammer Hardware could take approximately six minutes, depending on the time of day. Mangere Bridge Residents and Ratepayers

Twenty members attended the June meeting on a miserable rainy night. Once again there wasn't a Local Board member in attendance to keep us updated on Board activities. This was disappointing and the Board Chairman is to be asked to have a member attend our meetings. The forthcoming local bodies election was discussed.

Several persons have put their names forward and others will be approached. The proposed new road to Puketutu Island was discussed. Watercare intend to extend the treatment plant to the other side of Island Rd, so would not want traffic through the plant. Their proposal is for a new road from the intersection of Montgomery Rd and Ascot Rd. to run back North towards the treatment plant to join the existing road beyond the treatment plant. This would mean that visitors to the Island reserve that will soon be open to the public would have to face frequent trucks carrying bio solid waste to the Island restoration project for the next 35 years.

An earlier plan prepared by a previous Manukau City Councillor, showed a new road running from Oruarangi Road down to and along the foreshore of the 120 acre reclamation formed with the sludge dredged from the oxidation ponds. This plan gave access to the new area and to a new foreshore to compensate for the loss of the unique shell bank road that was destroyed with the constriction of the oxidation ponds. It was suggested that it was not Watercare's sole right to decide where the new road should go. The Association would wait on the Local Board at its next meeting to seek their support on this important matter. The mangrove jungle and rat reserve between the bridges had been referred to the Auckland Council. Their response to the request that the area be reclaimed was that the area had special archaeological features that should be preserved. The meeting resolved that this matter also be the subject of a meeting with the Local Board. Mark Erskine gave an update on the mangrove removal project. Manurewa organisations had gained a consent to remove a large area round the Puhinui Stream.

The assistance offered by the MP for Hunua Dr Paul Hutchison, has not yet borne fruit. Carol Anne Armitage, the Village manager discussed various problems in the Village. Top problem was the exposed aggregate footpaths laid a couple of years ago. Regular water blasting by contractors is eating away the concrete leaving a very sharp and hard to clean surface. The meeting was reminded that before the work was done, Council called a public meeting to consider the type of surface. Several examples were shown, including the surface that had been laid outside the Supermarket. That meeting was advised that the McCallum shingle surface had been used in the Mangere Town Centre, but had to be replaced due to injuries and the difficulty in cleaning. That meeting unanimously agreed that the same surface as had been laid outside the Supermarket be adopted. Council staff accepted that solution. How then did we end up with McCallums shingle? It turned out Council wanted to do both sides at the same time, but only had funds to do half in the pebble finish, but funds to do both sides in Mc Callums. So with no further reference to the community they ignored our choice and did the lot in McCallums. This is a prime example of how Council works. Next thing we will have to have the surface ground or the top 50mm removed and a safe presentable surface laid. The annual meeting of the Association will be held on Wednesday 15th August.

The next general meeting will be held on Wednesday 18 July at 7.30pm in the St James Church Hall.
