If you have passed the library recently you may be interested to know what all the construction is about. Thanks to a bequest from Mr. Charles Tuck they have been able to plan an outdoor courtyard at the rear of the library to use for their many activities. It will be a great asset to the community and a huge improvement on the overgrown garden and tall flax bushes that were there (some of which were donated to a school) which blocked sight lines for the CCTV cameras overlooking the rear car park. The courtyard will have seats, shade sails and better lighting.

The footpaths and parking areas are again covered with leaves. Business associations around Auckland are complaining constantly about the drop in service levels for footpath cleaning. Complaints made to our Local Board and Councilor Alf Filipaina have not brought any resolution so our business association has written to the Mayor. In addition the Central /South BID managers have requested representatives from Auckland Transport attend our next manager's meeting to seek better outcomes. In the meantime we have discovered that there is provision for extra cleans for leaf fall during winter so I am hopeful of seeing an improvement. In the meantime please take care as these leaves become slippery after rain.

Lindsay, our volunteer, who did lots of odd jobs around the village, is temporarily on holiday in Christchurch with his sister as his elderly parents have moved into a rest home. The family is looking for a small one bedroom unit or bedsit for him in Mangere Bridge. Please contact me if you know of anything suitable.

A ramp has been installed at the Post Office entrance. The original one was removed by the contractors who upgraded the footpath but didn't re-instate the ramp.

Mangere Bridge Pharmacy is now open on Sundays from 10am - 2pm. 8am - 6pm Mon -Fri, 9am - 1pm Sat.

HOP cards can be purchased or topped up at 'Top Dairy' in the Harcourts block where there is now also a rental agency.

WasteWise - Sweet Talks

Over 40 people, with a combined total of 774 years connection with Mangere Bridge, joined in the first of a series of neighbourhood 'Sweet Talks' at Ambury Farm last week. Hosted by Friends of the Farm and Foreshore, this fun and informative event drew local residents with connections to many local groups, including churches, schools, early childhood centres, sporting groups, interest groups and businesses.

The purpose of the gathering was to create another opportunity for people in the community to meet one another, to share what our Friends' WasteWise group has been doing in the community, to generate ideas for ongoing waste reduction in Mangere Bridge, and share practical tips.

We discussed what makes Mangere Bridge a "WasteWise, Caring Community" and practical ideas to enhance this vision. People highlighted their connections with others and suggested new ways to meet, including a community picnic. Many valued our public spaces and suggested ideas to ensure their ongoing care, building on previous efforts, such as clean-up projects and recycling workshops. We also discussed ways to upcycle, reuse and recycle.

After the event, Mangere Bridge resident, Damon Shelly offered fabulous feedback. "The biggest thank you," she said, "for hosting/creating this event.
