### **Mangere Historical Society**

Our September meeting was our AGM. It was the smoothest and most friendly meeting a visitor observed. St James Hall was full. The swift re-election of the President Janet Presland, Secretary Val Payne, and Treasurer Barbara Dixon was followed by the enthusiastic Committee of Naomi Kirk, Pat Blayney, Beverley Beattie, Barry Taylor, Judith Wilson, Val Benjamin, Val Sampson, Bryan Belcher and newly elected Jill Palmer. The President's report acknowledged the work that these people and others in the Society undertake in their own quiet way, that allows our Society to give this group the successful results that they achieve through out the year. Four years of research has allowed the researchers to amass several hundred names of men and women from Mangere, who went to represent their country in WWII, in the Pacific and the Mediterranean and Middle East battlefields. We have several hundred names, far more than the 100 recorded on the Roll of Honour in the War Memorial Hall and probably 87 that are not recorded on the Cenotaph website. Our 5 folios of information and photos will be loaned to the Museum so that they can add this data to theirs. It will then be retained at our Archives room near the CAB at the Mangere Town Centre for others to research should they want too. These rooms are open on Mondays from 10a. m. -1p. m. and are a treasure house of information on so much of Mangere's history and people. Well worth a visit. Some members spoke of what their children have achieved in their lives. A tasty afternoon tea followed and the members mixed and chatted with their friends, as other members of the public came in to the Hall to record their vote. Our next meeting is the third Tuesday on October and the speaker is talking about "Old Tools".
