Each child drew their chosen bird and wrote interesting facts about it. Classes voted on whose poster should represent the class. Chris Garton, from Watercare Services, had those selected drawings made into posters which are now displayed along the Ambury Farm Waterfront. Some of our classes will visit them this week when we put our feet first and walk down to the



farm for our Whanau Morning. The public are welcome to wander down and check out these informative posters to learn about our local birds. Copies of the posters are being compiled into a book. We have asked for a copy of this book to be donated to the Mangere Bridge Library so everyone can check out our local birds. Below is Chris Garton with some of the chosen children showing off their fabulous posters.

The godwits are on their way, come along and say hooray.

Bar-tailed godwits are long haul champions. Every year they fly huge distances to and from their breeding grounds in Alaska. Their outward journey is in two hops via the Yellow Sea then, after breeding, they return on a direct flight from Alaska to New Zealand. This non stop return journey of more than 11,000km across the Pacific Ocean is the longest known flight of any migratory bird.

Come and join us to wish these frequent flyers goodbye and good luck.

The morning will include a walk and talk, suitable for all ages, and family activities.

Mangere Historical Soceity

Mangere heard the recipe for success from David Veart.

This Onehunga ex Head boy from decades back, qualified as a Lawyer, Teacher and Archeologist He has spent a considerable amount of time, researching as DoC representative, the early gardens of the Maori dating back 650-750 years ago. He then started to investigate the very early cook books of the English. His first one was a massive tome that was meant for the lady of the house to use as she advised the "Cook" of all the things required of or by the household staff. Often the early cook books seemed to have stories accompanying the requirements. It was assumed that everyone knew how to cook meats, but many sauces and pickles to accompany the meats was including. He mentioned how the Maori gardens at Mangere, provided so much food for Onehunga settlers, as the Harbour Master had recorded the many canoe loads of fruit and vegetables landed at Onehunga's beach. Mrs Beeton's cookbook showed some very heavy and interesting diets. In 1850 Elizabeth Aitkin was the first cook book writer as we know them.

Those heavy tomes shown to us earlier, were not practical and smaller light-weight ones were published in Dunedin, that could be appreciated by the women who were educated sufficiently to read them. Mary Hooper wrote about using frozen foods. Recipes using Offal were also published. Lady Freyberg, wife of a Governor General of N.Z. at one time, had publisher her Scottish Mother's recipes which were very popular. Aunt Daisy's recipe book with its handy hints included was well known as was the much used Edmonds Cook book familiar to most women in N.Z.

The afternoon was completed with a celebratory afternoon tea for the Secretary on her New Year award of Q.S.M.for services



Mangere Bridge Residents and Ratepayers

Mangere Bridge Residents and Ratepayers met for their first meeting of the year. It was very encouraging to have new members come along to contribute their thoughts and concerns for this special area that we are fortunate to enjoy.

Mark Erskine, our designated Mangrove project leader has been pursuing various Council officers who are responsible for this area of council concern. It seems inexplicable that when this is their portfolio that they are not willing to come to a meeting with the Mangere people who have a passion for clearing these weeds from our much loved harbour foreshore. The Residents have worked very hard over the years to do the work that the Council should have been doing. There is a meeting to be held now on 3rd March and we await the outcome with great interest. The Local Board are now responsible for getting resource consent for more clearances.

Bill Kirk has for many years taken the cleaning of the all tide boat ramp as one of his many responsibilities. His concern regarding this facility and its problems has worried him and he has sent many letters to the various Officers of the Council. The answers that come back never really answer the concerns that have been pointed out.

He posed questions such as; - Who is responsible for the total failure of the upgrade to make the all-tide ramp what it is was meant to do? An all tide boat ramp that will be available for vessels to be launched and retrieved at all tide levels, and for rescue craft to be able to be launched and retrieved.

What steps are the Council going to take to rectify this serious and possible life threatening situation? Who is going to pay?

He has pointed out the history of the locals and their concerns for the inadequate ramp, meetings held with M.C.C. and promises and plans made by their officers.

Jim Jackson from Manukau Harbour Restoration Society has also expressed frustration at the lack of action from those concerned. The brand "Auckland Council" has been badly damaged through poor quality management decisions, by officers and politicians. He also strongly advocates for a formal enquiry in a responsible manner as has the R & R.

The need for more parking areas at the Bridge shops was expressed, as the popular eating places brings more and more people to the cafes.

A query regarding no taxi rank was made and the need to have phone numbers recorded, perhaps in the phone booth.

People travelling illegally on a friend's Gold Card had been observed on the buses. This seems to be costing out on many others.
