# Mangere Bridge Community Working Bee – 23 May 2015 Mangrove seedling removal - rain or shine

Mangere Bridge Residents and Ratepayers Association is organising its annual community working bee to remove mangrove seedlings from Shelly Beach and other parts of Kiwi Esplanade foreshore. This year there's been a huge influx of mangrove seed pods all along the foreshore and the seedlings in our beach area (by the playground and boat club) are particularly worrying. We need to get stuck in and get rid of them, or else we'll lose beach access and our beautiful views.

We have Council approval to remove seedlings. We ask our generous community volunteers to lend a hand and be part of a wonderful working bee:

WHEN: Saturday, 23 May - rain or shine

**TIME:** 9.00 - 11.30 am

WHERE: Meet at boat club car park (near playground at Shelly Beach) on Kiwi Esplanade

**WEAR:** Dress for the weather; gardening gloves if you have them &footwear that won't get

stuck in mud (sneakers or wet booties)

**BRING:** A sense of humour and a water bottle. Bring a bucket if you have one to put the seedlings in and you can then transfer them to bags provided on the shore.

# Mangere Bridge Residents and Ratepayers

Out March meeting had twenty people attending. Various matters were discussed. Bill Kirk advised that he had given up keeping the new boat ramp free of mud at low tides. The ramp has been rebuilt at a cost of over \$3m to overcome the problem, but nature has the last laugh as the new ramp was not raised to the level required to overcome the problem. Council has now decided to keep the ramp clear of mud. Time will tell. He has been trying to get NZTA to change the Mangere end of the new footbridge. Their plan is to locate it beside the all tide ramp which is already a pinch point. It would be better situated some 30 metres towards the motorway bridges thus separating the boat ramp operations from the users of the new bridge. This would require some reclamation which is a no no as the area between the bridges is zoned Coastal Protection Area 1. " An Area of Significant Archaeological Importance" The Association made submissions to the Proposed Auckland Unitary Plan asking that that zoning be lifted as there is only mangroves, mud, rubbish and rats in the already highly modified area. NZTA has recently informed us that the zoning is to change and reclamation will no longer be a prohibited activity, but they intend going ahead with their plan as that is all they have to do. What a pity that all the demolition material from the old bridge will be carted away to some distant landfill at considerable cost, instead of being used to double the width of the causeway. The location of the second runway at Auckland Airport will be open for public submissions as a review of the designation is to be held later in the year. Mangroves are an increasing problem. Mark Erskine our mangrove guru advised that there is a region wise agreement that local bodies should not control mangrove removal. They have such widely differing requirements and consent costs. We plan a public seedling removal working bee towards the end of April. The date to be advised at our April meeting. A resident advised that the proposed motorway tolls would be a big cost to Mangere residents who would have to pay \$2 every time they crossed the motorway bridge. He said it would cost him \$8 a day! Friends Of Ambury Farm had done a foreshore rubbish collection and had collected heaps. Good work folks. The next meeting will be on Wednesday 8 April at the St James Church hall at 7.30pm.
