Mangere Bridge Residents and Ratepayers

A good muster at the May meeting of the Assoc. We have received a resignation from our long serving secretary, Brian Pilkington. Brian has always been the doer in the neighbourhood, but his time has become too crowded as he has taken up a position with the Manukau Trust that runs all the Community Patrols in the area. He and Kay will still be very much involved with our own Local Patrol that has been n existence for many years We were the second group to operate in Manukau. Howick was the first, using their own cars with stick on labels We managed to raise funds to own our own car. Anyone interested in joining the group can drop into the Community constables office and find out how you can help protect our lovely Mangere Bridge. The meeting was concerned with the way the Auckland Super City was developing. Higher rates, more red tape, and residents not being listened to. It was resolved that we join a new residents group that has been formed specifically to provide one voice for the whole area. It was pointed out that it seems wrong that only property owners had to provide all the services that the million or more non property owners enjoy. There was concern expressed that there were many illegal discharges in the upper harbour that have never been addressed. Jim Jackson of the Manukau Harbour Restoration Society was to asked about this matter and perhaps come to our AGM in August to tell us what is or is not being done about it. There is to be a mangrove seedling pluck on May 23rd hail rain or snow. This is needed as there has been an enormous strike of seedlings along our foreshore. Gather at the Boat Club at 9.30 for a briefing.

A leg clean down service is to be provided. It was noted with great interest, that the Local Board through Auckland Council has called for tenders to remove all mangroves from the Mangere inlet that borders on the Board's area. Wow! The next meeting will be held at the St James Church Hall on Wednesday 10 June at 7.30PM.

The mangrove seedling pluck went ahead on Sat 23 May even though it rained continuously. Some fifty residents and children sloshed around in mud up to their knees and collected 70 bags of the intruders This was about 4000 seedlings! Well done Mangere bridge good folk. Bags and gloves were provided by Auckland Council and Ambury Farm Park Staff did all the collecting and piling the bags for Council collection. Our good owner of the Fresh Choice Supermarket provided fruit juice and cups for the thirsty Thank you very much Andrew. Tonnie Geux proved hot muffins to the hungry and Bill Kirk proved the wash down. Just squirted the water, no contact!!
