

MANGERE BRIDGE RESIDENTS' AND RATEPAYERS ASSOCIATION

The choice of two speakers at the April meeting of the Mangere Bridge Residents and Ratepayers Association highlighted two major community concerns.

Grant Taylor, Manukau City Council Director Strategy spoke about the reform of the governance of Auckland. The meeting expressed serious concerns about the government's proposals. It is clear that the community needs to make the politicians aware of its concerns before the legislation is presented in parliament.

An Invitations has been sent to Su'a William Sio MP for Mangere and the National and Act Parties to attend the Associations next meeting on 20 May. This meeting will provide an important opportunity for the residents of Mangere Bridge to make their views quite clear to the politicians. You are invited to come to the meeting and make your views known.

The second speaker was Bruce Nicholson, Manukau City Council Group Manager Regional and City Planning who spoke about the District Plan Change 14, Mangere Gateway Heritage Area. The development of the Mangere Gateway Heritage Area is a positive development for Mangere Bridge. It recognises the cultural and historical importance of Mangere Bridge and the surrounding area so as to create a tourist attraction.

However the absence of a plan for the development of the Mangere Bridge foreshore is a serious concern. The construction of the new it was felt bridge provides a golden opportunity to develop the foreshore. Unfortunately the situation is complicated by the fact that Manukau City Council, Auckland City Council, Auckland Regional Council and the Minister for the Environment all have a say in what the plan should be. All attempts to get these bodies to develop an agreed plan that meets the requirements of the local community have failed. The Manukau Harbour is a priceless asset for the local community and the foreshore should be the jewel in the crown. If you share the Residents and Rate Payers con-



ANY OLD BOTTLES

A fascinating story of glass

Mangere Historical Society members and friends packed the St James Church Hall on Tues 21st to listen to Lee Urquhart the popular Mangere Bridge Butcher speaking on his hobby of collecting old bottles.

He explained how the Egyptians had discovered that lightening strikes on sand made this glass like substance and how glass was made to replace the hollow stones, gourds and earthen ware containers previously used by primitive man and how the Romans made early glass containers for wine and perfumes.

While the glass making knowledge was almost lost in the centuries that followed.it was only by the middle ages that the art of glass making was preserved by the Monastery monks, making window glass.

Lee described the selection of bottles he had brought with him, many of a different colour, and shape; some embossed with the names of the pharmacists - Gillman, Turnbulls, and Macklows from Onehunga- as well as merchants whose wares had been displayed inside the containers.

There were bottles with a marble inside that had contained mineral water, ink wells of differing shapes, square Gin and Schnapps bot-

There were also two toned earthen ware containers on display, as well as Whitcombe and Stevens chutney jars, very early Breweries bottles with many of these stirring memories in of the past

A number of people came forward with bottles of their own and learned more about their history.

The selection of bottles collected by Lee had come from swamps on a local farm, muddy creeks and harbour areas as well as rubbish tips and under old houses in many localities. Bottles are swapped with other collectors while many can be highly esteemed and expensive to buy.



Community needs are increasing. In these extreme times sometimes the most generous gift is the one of time.




SPCA Invite Schools and Groups to Visit


