This year they will continue to focus on Literacy and Numeracy as well as learning with new technologies.....



The Association seeks to make the Manukau City Council and Government Departments aware of the views of the local community and to do that they need you to become involved if you care about what happens in the community.

Amongst the concerns raised at the meeting was the dust, from the commercial operations on Puketutu Island, that has been drifting into residential areas, particularly along Wallace Road. The most likely sources of the dust, it was felt, were the Living Earth composting plant and Winstone's Quarry.


The ARC has a phone number dedicated to complaints concerning air pollution. If the dust concerns you phone 379 2090.


BRIAN'S

The Auckland Regional Council recently amended its policy regarding the removal of mangroves. The Association has sent a letter to the ARC seeking clarification of the policy with particular reference to the area around the new bridge.

The government's cancellation of the housing area planned for Whenuapai has raised concerns that the houses will now be built in Mangere. The Association is seeking clarification from the Minister of Housing.

Councillor Taylor reported on the council's cost cutting on the ten year plan due to the economic crisis. In view of this it was felt very important that the community provide feedback to the Council when the plan becomes available for public consultation.






Thinking Ahead On Health


