The establishment of the super city is a fait accompli. Maintaining the identity of the Mangere Bridge community within the super city is a task for the coming year. Weather Helps with Security

If there is one benefit from the poor weather over the last few months it is that things have been very quiet on the security front, except for the ongoing battle with graffiti.

Whilst graffiti ranks at the low end of crime, it is a serious problem and impacts adversely on the way we view our community.

A zero tolerance policy is recommended automatically referring all persons caught tagging, or with spray cans, to the Police.

An issue that has been raised on a number of occasions is that of monitored alarms. Alarms are now very cost effective and reliable, and the monitoring costs around \$1 per day. Most insurance companies offer discounts for alarmed and monitored businesses that will probably off-set the purchase cost of the alarm. With monitored alarms, you can set up appropriate instructions for activations such as phone the owner/manager first and only dispatch a security patrol with authorisation of the owner/manager or if contact can not be made with nominated 'keyholders'.

Citizens Advice Bureau Hit by Cuts to Adult Education

Sally Te Rangi from Mangere CAB says that the planned 80% cuts to ACE funding will leave a significant gap in the opportunities for people from Mangere to learn news skills.

Adult Community education provides an important learning opportunity which can help people to become more confident and active in their own lives and in their community, says Sally

The CAB works to help people in our community to have the knowledge and confidence to understand and exercise their rights. "We support people with information and advice when they need it. So everyday in our service, we see the power of non-formal learning, where people are able to define and access what they need to know and subsequently take control over their lives.

With the cutting of funding to night school classes, people in NZ will lose one of the key avenues of non-formal life-long learning.

"We are deeply concerned that cutting ACE funding removes a vital learning pathway towards supporting people to be informed and active citizens" says Sally The CAB often informs clients with a variety of needs about the various courses and classes that are available through the ACE programmes.

It may be that someone is wanting to learn Te Reo or computer skills, pattern making or English as a second language. The great thing is that a wide range of affordable classes are available to meet people's needs

An evaluation by Pricewaterhouse Coopers in 2008 showed that ACE courses are an important stepping stone towards both improved career prospects and greater involvement in the communi-

Sally points out cutting ACE funding also removes an important source of funding for Citizens Advice Bureaux. Schools which are part of the ACE scheme currently have to make 9.5% of their funding

for programmes provided by community groups. "Over the last two years our bureau received over \$1,000 in funding to help train our volunteers". In 2008 our bureau assisted with 15.400 client enquiries on a wide range of issues from employment to custody of children all of which is reliant on having well trained volunteers. If the ACE funding cuts go ahead we will have to try and find resources for training from elsewhere, at a time when funding sources are drying up. This will put more strain on our already limited sources of funding says Sally.

The Citizens Advice Bureaux is an independent community organisation offering a free, impartial and confidential service of information, assistance and referral from 91 locations stretching from Northland to Invercargill. Last year volunteers received 639,000 enquiries on issues ranging from immigration, housing and employment to consumer rights, health and family.



Spring is Nearly Here with Lambs and Calves Starting to Make an Appearance

Welcome to the beginning of Spring, the daffodils are blooming as are the new farm arrivals, it's that time of year again! Lambs and calves are starting to make an appearance. With 400 ewes 'Down on Ambury Farm' are expecting around 600 lambs.

Each year they ask their park visitors to stay out of the lambing paddocks, as ewes and lambs are easily disturbed and separated. Often people see a lamb by itself and worry that it is lost, in most cases the mother is off grazing and has left her lamb in a spot to come back to.

By asking people to stay out of the lambing paddocks they have a lot less problem with lost lambs. Garry Hewson their farmer checks the ewes and lambs twice a day and keeps a very close watch on them.

They ask you to please let the Rangers know if you have any concerns, you can use the emergency phone to the right of the notice board or pop over to the office if you are at the park, or call the contact centre on 366 200 ext 2.

Lambing will be finished by mid September, then you are free to roam through the paddocks to watch the lambs at play.

Their 40 beef cows are also calving. If strolling through the farm, keep your distance from mother and baby as cows can be very over protective.

Cherry their pig is also blossoming with piglets brewing, the piglets are expected around the beginning of October, take a guess how many she may have, she is a first time mum.

Like always they are expecting a few orphan lambs so they invite you to come along and help bottle feed the lambs, this will start around the 20th of August, by that time any orphans they do have will be strong enough to run to the fence and drink a bottle with ease.


