Mangere Bridge Residents & Ratepayers Association

Following Les Dixon's election to the Mangere Community Board Dianne Clark was elected to replace him on the Residents and Ratepayers Committee.

At the Associations last meeting there was unanimous support by members to the proposal that the Onehunga rail link be extended to Mangere Bridge, the Auckland Airport, Wiri and Botany Downs before finally joining the existing rail at Panmure.

A letter supporting the proposal was to be sent to the Minister of Transport and representatives of all political parties in Parliament as well as local body politicians.

Vector Energy rejected the Associations request that power lines on Kiwi Esplanade be placed underground.

The meeting was told that the Council is introducing street orderlies to cover high profile town and main shopping centres where Council has a cleaning responsibility.

The meeting was told that the establishment of a Recreational Facility was stalemated as an agreement to find a way forward had not been reached. However the Council, it seems, would support the exploration of possible future recreational facility if the residents of Mangere Bridge proved that they had an interest for this type of facility.

Other matters covered were the development of the Mangere Gateway Heritage Destination aimed at visitors, the Associations submission to the Auckland Regional Council about their proposed plan change with regard to mangrove management and pointing out the potentially serious ecological and financial consequences from the unchecked spread of the mangroves and the concern about the control of stoats and ferrets on the Waterfront of Ambury Park.

The Associations next meeting will take place at St James' Church Hall, Church Road on Wednesday the 20th of February at 7.30pm.


