

## Ambury Farm Day Held on Beautiful Spring Day

The 1<sup>st</sup> Ambury Farm Day recalled by Robin Schwass, had very small beginnings with the original idea being to bring the town to the country allowing the towns people to experience all the things farmy shearing, milking, mustering, tractor rides, pony rides. These days Ambury Farm Day is a huge attraction for thousands of people from all over Auckland, but the country theme remains the same.

This year a crowd of some 23 000 people poured into the farm on a beautiful spring day to enjoy all the entertainment, activities and farm animals on offer. It was a wonderful family fun day down on the farm, with a record crowd!

Each year Ambury relies on 200 volunteers to get Farm Day alive and kicking. Without these people Farm Day couldn't run, so all those who volunteered on the day, should be congratulated

More farm news is that their pet lambs will be weaned by the end of October and on a full time grass diet.

They are still milking cows at 10.30am daily and will continue until mid December, there are also a few calves still being fed.

Polly their sow had 6 piglets on the 28<sup>th</sup> September, and they are growing so quickly! On another farm note, Stan Hall the farmer at Ambury for the past 5 1/2 years leaves to take on the role as farming co-ordinator for the Southern Sector parks, in addition to developing Waitawa, a new addition to the regional parks network. Stan has done a fantastic job managing the farm at Ambury while keeping the balance between faming and public recreation space.

Down on the foreshore, this is the time of year when the NZ Dotterel start laying, or should be if they if they were here. This is apparently the first time in many many years that the Dotterals haven't appeared. It definitely raises a few questions?

Now that the weather is picking up, and nights are getting longer, you are

invited to bring the kids down for a BBQ, use one of ours or bring your own, kick a ball around, take a walk through the farm, go on a bike ride and enjoy.

If you are bringing groups bigger than 50 it is important that you book, especially as the park becomes more popular (ph 366 2000 ext 2). However remember they are a rubbish free park, so take your rubbish home with you where you can recycle it.

They also have a campground which costs \$10 per night. For large groups please make sure you book (ph 366 2000 ext 2),. For 2 - 4 people go to the Ambury Office, if the ranger is not there use the emergency contact to the right of the notice board, you can also set up camp in the campground and they will find you.

Take note that the gates are locked at 8.00pm and open again at 8.00am.

# ICON Security Offers Some Suggestions

With the arrival of daylight saving and the weather starting to get warmer it is probable that you will see groups of youths congregating late at night and in the early hours of the morning around the township and in parks etc. Associated with these groups one normally finds problems with graffiti and vandalism.

The Icon Patrols will move these groups on during the patrol visits however it is also very important that store owners take some steps to assist with the problem:

Points to observe:

Ensure that external lighting is working

Ensure that your premise is fully secured, especially doors and windows at the rear of your building

Do not leave materials outside that may be used to break windows etc (i.e. wood, pipes, bricks etc)

Do not leave empty boxes and rubbish lying loose outside as this can be dispersed throughout the township

If you are having problems with groups or gangs of youths, report it to Carol-Anne the Village Manager and she will liaise with Icon (may be they might be able to change the timing or frequency of their patrol visits)

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

## **Mangere Historical Society**

Members hear how Otuataua Stonefields were formed

Lucy MacIntosh a young historian came and spoke very knowledgeably about the Otuataua Stonefields. She explained how the area that became Auckland was, 15,000 years ago, a low-lying silt and sand formation gently sloping towards the two rivers, which eventually became our massive Harbours.

Once the Volcanic activity started, clusters formed, spraying the land with molten lava and rock bombs, forming underground rivers and eventually as the top layer cooled, large volcanic caves.

At that time Ihumatao was covered with kauri forest. The two volcanic cones on this 100 hectare piece of land, Puketapa and Ihumatao, smothered the land with magna flow, lava and ash. The kauri forest now remains in petrified form at the end of Renton Road. Over the next 30,000 years the land became covered with large ferns and other fauna.. Underground rivers drained the water and volcanic soil was formed.

These stonefields are one of very few areas where one can trace the occupation by man from approx 1000 A.D. The first settlers came from Eastern Polynesia in the Tainui canoe, via the Waitemata, portaged to the Manukau and eventually settled at Kawhia. They dropped families off at various places including the Ihumatao area.

The Nga Oho tribe was established at this time and artifacts have been found here and at Puketutu Island verifying this. They gardened and used the organic matter to compost the land. The warmth from the rocks sheltered their gardens while fish and shellfish offered variations to their diet.

The Nga Iwi tribe, descended from Nga Oho, was formed as this group grew in numbers and amiably split. In 1600 the Waiohua tribe occupied the Auckland Isthmus under the leadership of Chief Kiwi Tamaki .He lived at Maungakiekie- One Tree Hill. They were descended from Nga Iwi people.

At this time there were approx 2000 people occupying this area. Each hapu/ family had their own area on the Stonefields and gardened their land using the loose rocks to fence or divide their properties. Kumera, taro and gourds were popular plants. A rare native cucumber measuring approx half an inch, has

been found there also

In 1750 the Far North Ngati Whatua tribe declared war on their southern neighbours and Kiwi Tamaki was killed in battle, between Huia and Titirangi. Others were killed, enslaved and some intermarried with these warriors. Once again people called Nga Oho settled on the Stonefields in the Spring and Summer seasons to work their gardens.

Capt Cook introduced potatoes, corn and peaches which added to their diet. In the 1820s the Auckland area was deserted but by 1836 people returned and planted their crops and gardens again. The Methodist Church established their Mission Station at Taotaoroa, next to Elletts Mountain(Puketapa). In 1863 Gov. Grey decreed that all Maori must swear allegiance to British Crown. Many opted to leave their lands and move to the Waikato. This allowed their lands to be confiscated and given to early settlers. In the Ihumatao case the four families were Rennies, Wallace, Mendelsohn and Elletts. The Scottish people used their knowledge to build up the drystone dykes ( fences) to clear the land and make their paddocks

While the land was difficult to farm, they however planted many trees which have withstood the test of time. Baches built on their beach frontages were enjoyed by many of Auckland's professional families through the summer season until the 1960s.

The Stonefields are owned and run by Manukau City Council as a reserve and are a unique area in the vicinity of Mangere

A major Auckland-wide handbag snatching ring has recently been uncovered.


Recent raids involving 30 officers with 15 search warrants resulted in nine men being arrested.
