

# Students Participate in BASF Kids Lab Programme

30 students from years 4 to 6 experience life in a science laboratory

Early in November BASF, the Chemical Company offered a limited number of places in their BASF Kids Lab programme to students from Waterlea School. Thirty lucky students with a strong interest in Science were selected from Years 4 to 6 to experience life in a real science laboratory.

During the visit the students were treated to a hands on chemistry session where they experimented with a number of different chemicals under a variety of scientifically controlled conditions.

The students loved the opportunity to be real scientists for a day and appreciated the generosity shown to them by the BASF Chemical Company.

Waterlea School is proud that Marina Povey, a year 5 student, has been selected to attend the Gifted Kids Programme at Waikowhai School for their one day a week class in 2008. In late November the Waterlea School Library is to be showcased to visitors from schools in the Waikato as an exemplary model school library.

Linda Jeffares, the designated librarian and Penny Jensen, the school's Deputy Principal, have worked hard to create a learning environment that not only encourages students to be motivated to use the library effectively but is a place were reading is fostered as a fun activity.

Throughout the year the Waterlea BOT fund a variety of programmes to enhance learning opportunities for students. The Phonemic Awareness Programme is one such programme.

A designated teacher, Andrea Jamieson, works with a team of trained teachers aides who individually tutor students.

The one on one support assists students to be aware of the sounds letters make, As the students' awareness improves so too does the reading levels. The BOT are pleased with their investment as the results from this intervention brings students' reading ages up to and in some cases beyond their chronological age.

Two walking school buses are now operating at Waterlea. The school is pleased that so many of the pupils are exercising. It is a healthy attitude towards getting to and from school.

# Irish Magic at the Historical Society

Lilting Irish Music and Irish Fables

The last meeting of the Mangere Historical Society was both interesting and entertaining.

Those attending were entertained by the delightful Katherine Mowbray who in addition to playing some gloriously lilting music told some wonderful Irish

The audience were left enthralled by her stories as well as her music

The speaker for the day was Stewart Harvey from Watercare who showed very interesting slides and related the history of the many dams and springs that have supplied Auckland over the years

Apparently apart from the water tanks and creeks, the settler utilised Auckland's Domain Springs (now the duck pond) while later on Western Springs became a source of supply.

The exploration of the Waitakere Ranges resulted in the harnessing of the streams and rivers there to provide water which is the necessity of life.

Wooden Dams such as Nihotapu which was built in 1900 were eventually replaced with hand mixed concrete versions.

To carry supplies from the Manukau Harbour to the work sites a narrow gauge rail line was built, with the workers living in primitive huts alongside the rail line while the dams were built

William Langland, the contractor commissioned to build the concrete, was killed on site which saw Auckland Council workers being brought in to complete the project using equipment which had earlier been used on the Waitakere Dams.

With no roads, horses and sleds were used to move the equipment.

The Hunuia Ranges were used for the Cossey Dam in the 1950 - 1955 and the 60 metres high Mangatawhiri Dam in 1961 - 1965.

These dams provide 350,000 cubic tons of water per day to the ever growing Auckland City.

After the address, afternoon tea was provided to round off a most enjoyable day.

# Guided Walk on Mangere Mountain

This is an opportunity to discover how the Mountain was formed and to explore the history of the people who lived on the mountain.

Mangere Mountain is one of the best preserved volcanoes in Auckland with much evidence still remaining of the people who once lived here.

Mangere Mountain Education Centre will provide guided walks on the mountain on Thursday the 13th December as well as on the 10th of January 2008.

Walks start at the Education Centre, 100 Coronation Road, Mangere Bridge, at 9.45am ending around Midday.

The cost is \$5
